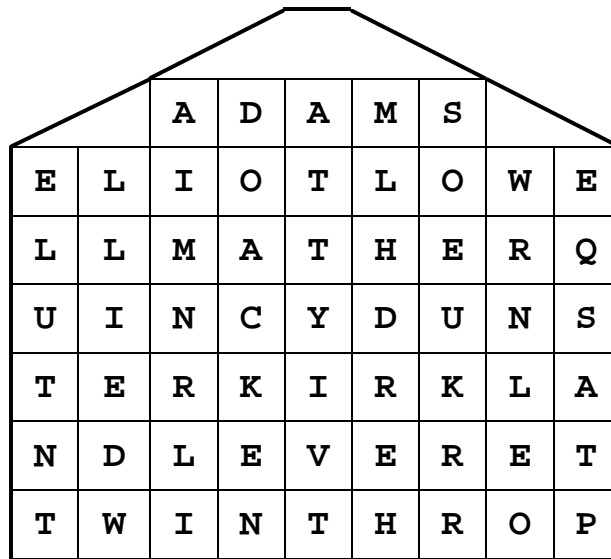

Note: The puzzle features the names of the Harvard residential houses located favorably (in the eyes of students) near or along the Charles river—**Adams, Eliot, Lowell, Mather, Quincy, Dunster, Kirkland, Leverett, and Winthrop**. Other houses are less favorably located in the Radcliffe Quadrangle, otherwise known as "the Quad," which is at a considerable remove from the main campus.
